Ariel is an American Jr. Golfer who has demonstrated a winning flair in numerous junior golf tournaments. Since 2016, Ariel has won over 90 Jr Golf Tournaments, 10 Local Tour Championships, 3 Georgia State Titles, and 2 Player of the Year Awards. Ariel is also the 2x U.S. Kids Golf World Champion (2020 & 2021) with a 3rd place finish in 2022, while also earning Five top 20 finishes in the U.S. Kids World Championships. Ariel has won other tournaments including the Western Georgia Jr. Classic (2022 & 2023), Peggy Kirk Bell Golf Tour, the Orange Whip Classic 2022 (PKGBT), and the 2023 PGA Georgia Southern Jr Classic.

Ariel realized at an early age that hard work pays off both on the course and in life. She won her first tournament at the age of 6 and has won multiple events since. Ariel enjoys community service and has volunteered with the Special Olympics of Henry County, GA, Sisters by Choice, Inc. General Tournament Information

OVERVIEW

The BMWGA Women's Only Tournament is a 2-day **36-Hole Stroke Play Tournament** played in accordance with current **USGA Rules of Golf** except as modified by local rules or the Tournament Committee. All participants will play by the same rules, from the forward tees whether competitive, sassy seniors or non-competitive. The tournament will be played on 27 holes at Flat Creek Country Club - Homestead (9), Old Mill (9) and Graveyard (9). Winners will be announced and prizes awarded at the banquet held at the clubhouse on Saturday starting at 6 PM.

The competitor with the lowest 2-day gross score will be the **Gross Tournament Champion** and the player with the lowest 2-day net score will be the **Low Net Tournament Champion**. The gross and net champion will be lifted from their flight and 3 prizes will be awarded in each flight - 1st through 3rd place.

FRIENDLY FIRE STATE COMPETITION

A state must have at least 5 golfers to qualify for this competition. The champion will be determined by combining the total of the 5 lowest scores on Friday (Day 1) and the 5 lowest scores on Saturday (Day 2) for each state. (This could be 10 scores from 10 different individuals). Winning State is recorded on the plaque.

FLIGHTS AND PAIRINGS

Participants are flighted and paired based on division of play - competitive, sassy senior or non-competitive.

<u>Non-Competitive</u> - All participants for the non-competitive division are in 1 flight and paired randomly as handicap is not required. Awards are given based on scorecard drawing. The chance of winning is increased by submitting a scorecard for both days. Scores will not be tallied.

<u>Competitive and Sassy Seniors</u> – Participants are flighted by division and handicap within the division. Handicaps are verified by the Tournament committee in advance of the event and capped at a max of 40.

Pairings for Day 1 (Friday) are based on handicap. Pairings for Day 2 will be based on Day 1 results.

An individual's score for Day 1 and Day 2 is combined to determine champions and flight winners. If there is a tie, it will be broken by a second day scorecard playoff using USGA recommendation of 9-6-3-1. Last 9 (10-18), then last 6 (13-18), then last 3 (16-18), then last hole. This method is preconfigured in Golf Genius.

The Tournament Committee reserves the right to re-flight a golfer if there is a significant difference in scores relative to their handicap and assigned flight. Please keep in mind that every effort is made to make this tournament as fair as possible, fun for all, and to allow everyone an opportunity to win.

PROXIMITY PRIZES

All participants, competitive, sassy senior and non-competitive will compete for proximity prizes. Contest holes are listed below:

- Long Drive
 - Homestead Hole 3
 - Old Mill Hole 2
 - Graveyard Hole 1
- Closest to the Pin
 - Homestead Hole 9
 - Old Mill Hole 5
 - o Graveyard Hole 9

SCORE CARDS

Players should exchange score cards with an opponent in your group. The scorekeeper will sign the card. The golfer should double check the score before also signing the card. Turn in all signed cards to the Pro Shop. Once the card is turned in no changes will be made. NO EXCEPTIONS!!!

INCLEMENT WEATHER

Please be advised that the BMWGA website will provide up-to-date information on any changes due to weather forecast or other unusual situations. Players will also receive a text message or email notification.

For inclement weather during play, both players will be notified by the staff at Flat Creek Country Club on how to proceed.

Rules Information

RULES OF PLAY

- Play under and in accordance with current USGA Rules of Golf except as modified by local rules or the Tournament Committee.
- 2. All participants will play by the same rules including non-competitive.
- 3. Play the ball as it lies, Rule 9.1.
- 4. Ball in penalty areas (bodies of water or other areas as defined by the committee) is played in accordance with Rule 17 http://www.usga.org/content/usga/home-page/rules-2019/rules-of-golf/rule-17.html.
- 5. In accordance with Rule 21.2 Maximum Score, the tournament Committee has capped the maximum score as **double par plus 1** for all players.
- 6. Alternative to Stroke and Distance Penalty When a player's ball is lost or is known to be out of bounds, for two penalty strokes, the player may take relief by dropping the original ball or another ball in the

designated relief area. See Model Local Rule E-5 for details. <u>Stroke and Distance: New Local Rule (usga.org)</u>.

- 7. Cell phone usage during competition is limited to tournament related functions (i.e. GPS, Rules of Golf, Golf Genius,etc.) and emergency situations. Your phone must be on silent during the competition.
- 8. The following will result in player disqualification:
 - Failure to report to designated tee box at starting time
 - Failure to exchange scorecard at the beginning of play
 - Playing a hole out of sequence
 - Failure to sign scorecard or signing incorrect scorecard
 - Leaving the course without turning in a scorecard
- 9. If there is any doubt as to procedure, play a second ball; announce you are hitting a second ball and which one you will score if allowed. Request a ruling prior to attesting scorecard.
- 10. All golfers should direct questions to the Golf Pro or designated Rule Official for any rules questions during the tournament or make note of your question and check in with the Golf Pro before signing and turning in your scorecard.

Local Rules and Course Information

Local Rules

- Fans on the course free relief, temporary immovable obstruction, even if the ball is in a penalty area.
- Mulch areas played as ground under repair, play ball out of those areas.
- Stones on Homestead course played as cart path rule. Nearest relief no closer to the hole.

Bag Drop

Flat Creek does not have a designated bag drop area. The staff would prefer that everyone drive up and park in an available parking spot. They will provide a 6-passenger cart driving around the parking lot to shuttle players to the cart staging area. Or, if you prefer not to wait for the shuttle, you can walk your bag down to the cart staging area where Flat Creek staff will assist players with finding your assigned cart and loading your bag. Please plan to arrive early.

Restrooms and Water Coolers

- Restrooms
 - Located on Hole #5 of each side Homestead, Graveyard, and Old Mill
- Water coolers
 - Homestead Hole 3 and Hole 8
 - Graveyard Hole 3 and Hole 8
 - Old Mill Hole 2 and Hole 7

Pace of Play

TIPS ON PACE OF PLAY

- 1. Play "Ready Golf".
- 2. Keep up with the group in front of you.
- 3. Pick up after **double par plus 1** (maximum score established under Rule 21.2).
- 4. Be ready to play when it is your turn to play.
- 5. Do not search more than the permitted 3 minutes for a potentially lost ball.
- 6. Plan your shot while walking to your ball or while others are playing.
- 7. Take several clubs with you to your ball so you won't have to walk back to the cart.
- 8. Line up your putt when others are putting
- 9. A player should take not more than 40 seconds to make a stroke after the player is able to play without interference or distractions.
- 10. Play 2 balls if uncertain of correct procedure. Report facts to the tournament director or designated rules person before turning in scorecard.
- 11. Apply the alternative to stroke and distance penalty in lieu of hitting a provisional, when appropriate.
- 12. Consider leaving the flagstick in the hole when putting (no penalty if the ball hits the flagstick).
- 13. Exit the green promptly after holing out. Record scores and replace clubs at the next teeing area.


